## Scarecrow Festival & Fair 2020

The Scarecrow Committee has met twice since August and has now finalised a number of details for next year's Festival & Fair. Whilst there's still plenty to do before next May, we thought you'd like an update on plans.

I've agreed to stay on as Chairperson for another year, although for work reasons I won't be able to take on as much as I have done in the past.

As you will know, the government has decided to move next year's May Day Bank Holiday from the first Monday in May to the following Friday, to coincide with the 75th anniversary of VE Day. [we were disappointed Worzel wasn't consulted before they did so!] The Parish Council and Institute Committee have supported our suggestion that the village marks the occasion with a Jacob's Join street party on the school field, with 40's music and singers.

Next year's theme will be "Victory" – in recognition of the VE Day anniversary

Thanks to everyone who contributed their thoughts and ideas for next year's event at the 'Thank You' barbecue in August. We had lots of helpful suggestions for future Festivals and as a result have decided to:

- Not run the Soap Box Derby next year, as we're planning the VE Day celebration party, but review this for 2021
- Aim for a wider variety of stallholders, with more interactive activities for families
- Encourage more villagers to enter the Scarecrow Competition by adding a new 'Lottery' category - choosing an entry number at random from all those that have a scarecrow displayed by the first Saturday - with a £50 cash prize
- Share with the Institute Committee the suggestion that the building is 'smartened up a bit' and support its plans to run 'Film Nights' in the Institute
- Continue with refurbishing the Giant Scarecrows
- Making the Festival more environmentally friendly, by introducing 'recycle rubbish' bins and asking stallholders to avoid using single use plastics wherever possible
- Look into including a 'Treasure Trail' during the Festival

Sadly, last month we lost Peter Foster, a greatly loved and admired person by all who knew him. He was heavily involved in the Scarecrow Festival, before, during and after the event - always ready to help out wherever he could. One of the many things he will be remembered for was his clever moving scarecrows, so we've decided to recognise his contributions to the village and the Scarecrow Festival by awarding in his memory a 'Peter Foster Trophy' for the best mechanical scarecrow.

As ever, some extra help organising and running the Scarecrow Festival would ease the pressure on current helpers. We appreciate quite a few villagers, having volunteered for many years, have rightly decided they've done their bit'; however we hope others, including those newer to the village, may be able to spare some time before and/or during the Festival. You don't have to join the Committee (though you're welcome to come along to meetings - usually held once a month in the George and Dragon on a Thursday evening) to help. Most tasks don't take long and happen at different times and days of the week, so we're sure we can find something for you to do even if you only have limited time to spare. Tasks are also straightforward, so don't feel you need to have special talents to get involved. Moving the Bank Holiday has meant that we've had to change our usual Festival dates, with some events having to move to different days. This should only be for one year though.
