Wray Neighbourhood Plan - submission, consultation and examination

Thank you to everyone who has contributed so far for your patience. It has been a long and detailed process to get to this point, most recently with amendments and updates following the local consultation in the autumn. But after approval at the recent Parish Council meeting the plan has now been submitted to the City Council for the formal six-week consultation and examination.

The City Council will now set up a Wray Neighbourhood Plan web page on their website. This will contain links to all the relevant documents. There will be a press release, and other publicity including through social media. Those on the planning policy consultation list will also be contacted. Paper copies will be provided in Morecambe and Lancaster Town Hall on request. In Wray, of course, there will be the most publicity so that everyone is again fully consulted and able to comment.

Background. The Neighbourhood Plan is mostly concerned with future development to meet the housing needs of the village, including where development may be best placed. A previous local housing survey to all homes identified needs and an opinions survey showed a desire that the village be allowed to grow at a slow pace, following its historical development since the mid-20th century, thereby preserving its character and community cohesion. The Neighbourhood Plan was drawn up and developed to meet these needs in conjunction with the wider statutory planning objectives. Professional support was brought in to facilitate this at various points and, as you know, there has been much consultation along the way.

Next Steps. Following this last round of consultation, external examination and amendment there will a referendum of the entire parish.

Minutes of Neighbourhood Planning Group meetings are on the Parish Council website (just Google Wray Parish Council).
