1. Entry is open to residents of the Civil Parishes of Wray, Tatham and Roeburndale and to any child attending Wray School. Visitors to Wray will also be welcome to participate.

**FRIDAY BETWEEN 6.30 pm and 8.00 pm**  
**SATURDAY BETWEEN 9.00 am and 10.30 am ONLY**  
Entries may be booked-in and tickets obtained on the Friday evening, and arranged on the Saturday morning.
3. The Village Hall doors will be closed at 10.30 am for judging and open again at 2.30 pm for viewing.
4. Kindly ensure that entries from children have their age marked on the front of the ticket **BUT NOT THEIR NAME.**
5. It is hoped that exhibitors will allow their exhibits to be auctioned in aid of the Institute funds. Any additional items which can be provided for auction will be gratefully received.
6. Exhibits not to be sold in the auction should be collected from 3.00pm. The auction will commence at 3.15pm.
7. Exhibitors must provide their own vases and containers.
8. The Committee cannot accept any responsibility for loss or damage to property.
9. Certificates will be awarded.
