As of September 19th (only 17 days since the launch) the total stands at £2.441.92

A **huge** 'Thank You' to everyone who has donated, we appreciate your generosity and support.

We have been given a target of £16,000 for a brand new motorcycle, liveried in the hi-viz colours of an official Blood Bike and that will carry the name 'Peter Foster' on its fairing. It is good to know that when this first 'Peter Foster' Blood Bike has had its day, its replacement will always be known as the 'Peter Foster'. The North-West Blood Bikers are volunteers who rely on public donations and give their time, with no cost to the NHS, to ferry life-saving products (blood, medicines, patient records, hospital equipment, baby milk, etc.) to hospitals and hospices throughout the North-West and beyond.

Peter was such a 'larger than life' character, know, admired, and even loved by so many of you that we invite you to help us raise the funds needed for what will be a fitting, and lasting memorial to him. Funds raised by his family, his friends in the village and surrounding areas, his ex-work colleagues, and his many many friends in the biking community.
